The President's Report 2020-21 by Robert Sage

It has been great to welcome a number of new members to our Society Guest speakers at our meetings have included Peter Vanzuyden who spoke about his family in the Netherlands during the years of WWII and his experiences as a member of a migrant family coming to the area in the 50s. Richard Lester and Rodney Emmerson spoke about the history of Mossvale Park and the on- going work needed to preserve the park for the future. Bob Newton, a man who has a great passion for preserving history, told us a little of his life as well as the books he has written. His noted books are on the origins of place, road and street names throughout South Gippsland Shire. There will be four books, one for each of the former shires that make up the current Shire of South Gippsland. At our meeting Bob was presented a Gippland Region History Award for his work in recording this

Our annual Anzac lunch at the RSL was very well attended. Lyn Skillern spoke about the service men and women who came from Woorayl Shire in WWII and ultimately lost their lives serving their country.

Despite the difficult year much good work has been done by the Society.

Following a presentation of a proposal to upgrade the Memorial Hall by Peter Western on behalf of Lyric Theatre, a letter of support from our Society was written to assist in their submission to the South Gippsland Shire.

Lyn Skillern has continued her research project to record the history of the men and women from the Woorayl Shire who enlisted for service in WWII and lost their lives. The stories are now on our website and a wall of photographs is on display in the hallway. This project was funded by a grant from the Department of Veterans Affairs.

A great deal of work and research was carried out by our members in setting up the exhibition on the emergency services operating in the district. A special thanks must go to Alan McGuinness and George Misson. I hope this display can be seen by members of the community when life returns to some normality.

With social media playing such a big part of modern living we receive many requests for information on personal and family history. Although responding to these requests falls mainly on one person, Lyn, I do feel it is of benefit to the Society to help people in this manner.

An annual report would not be complete without a list of thankyous to members of the Society. VALE. Mavis Wightman

It was with great sadness that the community said farewell to Mavis Wightman who passed away on 19 September. Mavis was a great friend of our Society. She provided valuable information and many photographs and items of memorabilia for our collection. She also assisted with flower arrangements when relevant to displays including making fresh bouquets for our exhibition on weddings.

Mavis was born Mavis Myrtle Maxwell on 29 July 1923 in Leongatha. Her parents were Haswell (Barney) Maxwell and Janet Bell. She grew up on her family's farm at Leongatha South and attended Leongatha primary and high school.

After leaving school Mavis worked for Oliver Gilpin who ran haberdashery stores throughout Australia. She first worked at the Leongatha store which was located on the site of Smith's McCartin St shop. Mavis later worked in the Korumburra store and elsewhere in Victoria and Tasmania. After WWII Mavis married Ken Wightman and they had five children Max, Jenny, Lester, Heather and Alan. Ken and Mavis lived on the Wightman's farm and later in Parr St.

Mavis was a great gardener and floral artist. She was a long- term member of the horticultural society and the CWA. A hardworking volunteer Mavis assisted many groups in the district and will be fondly remembered for her generosity and good humour.




A Leongatha High Netball team from the 1930s. Mavis is at the end of the line. She said she was the shortest player.
